

PRIMARY PROJECTS AND ACTIVITIES 2021/22

As mentioned in the SV update, we cannot offer such an extensive program as usual this school year due to the corona situation and personnel situation. In the Playgarden we try to separate the groups of classes Y1 & Y2 and Y3 & Y4 as much as possible. With some of the other offers this is not possible. In flexible SV we look after the children across all ages. In flexible SV the Y1 & Y2 will have the Circle Time in the SV Room and the Y3 & Y4 will have the Circle Time in the Silent Room.

The children are supervised before and after projects and activities.

Football Club I & II	Football is a very popular Sport in our Society. The Football Club is an opportunity to make the first steps into this Sport and feel the joy of moving. Sport makes it easy to find new friends, to learn how to work in a team and develop your individual motor skills. In the first term of the schoolyear, FBC I for Year 1 & Y2 will take place and in the second term of the schoolyear (starting in February) FBC II will take place. Games & sports	Having fun together with group games and activities. Y1 & Y2 in uneven weeks, Y3 & Y4 in even weeks. In the other week, the children will stay in flexible SV. Schoolyard in front of the Oase or German Playground
Homework Club	The students start their homework in a quiet room after having a break following class time. (Y2-Y4)
Tranzone	means Tranquillity Zone. We have set up a place and time for relaxation and calmness in school. We impart different kinds of relaxation methods for the children`s repose and regeneration. Mental and emotional health is now seen as a vital part of education and children`s well-being. A club offer will take place for the Y3 & Y4 on Wednesday, for Y1 & Y2 we plan a chilling open offer one afternoon. Silent Room 2 nd floor Primary building
Designing and painting with colours	Get to know the world of colours. We will experiment with different colours and materials and create various things with it. Art Room
Outdoor Games and Nature Activities on Mondays	Create and explore outside using adventure and nature. We provide materials and environments that create challenges, spark imagination, and encourage creativity which lets students experience nature with its changing seasons, wind, light, sounds and weather from a different perspective. We create and interact with nature whilst discovering connectedness with all living things. Through learning about sustainability students will be more able to contribute to protecting our natural habitats – and our future. Playgarden
Gardening and Cooking Day on Tuesdays	<u>Gardening:</u> Whats “growing on” in the garden? What makes plants grow -what makes them prosper? Exploring the plants and animal habitats of a garden! Teaching students about organic gardening is a beautiful way to give them a sense of wonder and respect for nature. We will go along with the cycle of the seasons as they arise, in the garden. The main topics range from seed sowing and planting in spring, growing and ripening during summertime, harvesting and preserving in fall, to collecting power and reposing in winter. <u>Cooking-</u> How to prepare a yummy meal out of seasonal vegetables and fruits during corona time? This will be the challenge for the next month in Cooking Club. We will explore manifold opportunities to prepare meals, to preserve food and learning different ways to cook over an open fire. Thereby students will hone motor skills and learn how to responsibly handle sharp and other tools. The gardening and cooking groups will switch weekly. Playgarden
Arts and Crafts Activity Day on Wednesdays	This activity will provide a platform for the pupils to create new things and allow them to express themselves. Arts and crafts projects can spawn a sense of achievement and give a boost of self-esteem. Different activities like hut-building, carving, felting, painting, making mosaics, (...), will be offered, using various materials like wood, leather, wool, clay, stone and metal. Playgarden

Forging	Learn forging basics – a timeless craft! Playgarden
Backpack Club	As children grow into middle childhood, group interactions take on more meaning for children, as their social world has expanded to include friends outside of the family circle. School has become the focus of their social lives. These interactions are much more like those to be experienced in adulthood and children learn the subtle dance of communication in these early settings. Many of our children are attending Supervision the whole week. To create greater continuity and participation for children who stay regularly in Supervision we will establish a constant group supported by a professional educator. The group will meet once a week to spend an afternoon together. This makes it possible to respond to the individual needs and current concerns and worries more directly. The children can benefit from the solidarity of a group in a liable and safe setting. A “backpack” of Ideas and activities will be offered every time the group meets and the children will have a choice what they respectively want to do. Playgarden Clubs

Playgarden:

Each day we offer different core themes in the Playgarden. The children can participate in a project or are allowed to play freely. If your child wants to join the Playgarden without attending a Playgarden club, please mark "Playgarden Free play" on the sign up form **except Thursdays**. Y1& Y2 students meet with the Supervisor in the back part of the Cafeteria of the Primary building (lunch room) and the Y3 &Y4 students meet in the front part of the Cafeteria with the Supervisor and then walk to the Playgarden

For a healthy and secure Playgarden visit please make sure that you bring the following items on your Playgarden days: sunshade, sun block (summer); rain clothes: rain jacket, rain pants, wellingtons; towel, 2nd pair of socks, pants and a shirt in case the clothes get wet.

Change: Currently we are still looking for a solution to store the Playgarden clothes of your children. Exception: We can store the wellington boots for you. Therefore, we ask you to make sure that your child brings appropriate clothing to their Playgarden days.

Due to the good experiences during the corona time, we decided that the children will not go back to school. **Please pick up your child at the Playgarden directly.** If your child participates in a certain club offer, please do not pick up him or her before 5.30pm. PG freeplay can be picked up at the earliest at 3.30pm.

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Sportclub procedure:
